Your child may be able to get **free school meals** if you get any of the following (*correct at time of writing July 2023*):

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after I April 2018 your household earnings must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

How long will it take to process the claim Free School Meals?

The Local Authority aims to process applications within 5-10 working days. Once they have determined the outcome of the application they will advise our academy and you will be issued with a letter.

Food banks provide a minimum of three days emergency food to people in crisis, alongside additional support.

Food banks work with frontline professionals to identify people who need support and give them a food bank voucher. These professionals include local agencies like children's centres, housing associations, advice charities, and mental health teams, who are best placed to assess need.



Current Support

- All students have access to free breakfast from 8 am in the dining room.
- Free School Meals students are encouraged to purchase a main meal including desert and drink at lunchtime.
- All enrichment activities are free to all students.
- All Year 7 students are provided with a free uniform.
- Used uniform donated back to the academy is washed and available freely to students who require it.
- All Year 7 students will be provided with essential equipment at the start of term.
- The Hardship Fund can be accessed to support purchasing uniform and other items. See policy for full details on our website <u>here</u>.
- MyOn library (online) was purchased so all students can access books at home or at school.
- Most trips in school have been free to all students.
 We ask for voluntary contributions to help with the cost of the trips.
- DT we cover the majority of costs and ask for a small contribution.
- Period products are free for students to access throughout the day in various places around the academy.
- Staff are on hand to help with any questions or to discuss support in the strictest confidence.

There are many other support mechanisms such as one to one tutors and other applications which aid to remove barriers to learning and help students flourish which can be reviewed in our Pupil Premium policy.
