Subiect Updates

All subjects give a high importance to reading within their subject

English



New Read Aloud books have been purchased for all KS3 and we have just started our new books across the year groups. These are now differentiated to suit the tastes of the class. Please encourage all KS3 pupils to keep a reading book in their bags as part of their equipment. There is a wide range of books in the LRC to suit all tastes.

To raise literacy attainment at every level of ability across all phases of a child's education - supporting every child to be a reader. We have a responsibility to promote and enhance students' literacy levels working together to systematically integrate the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing across our curriculum. This will maximise the potential of each student and prioritise good literacy skills for learning and life.





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Maths



This month in Maths we are focusing on our key words - percentage is featured very highly at KS3 especially the fact it is out of one hundred or "per" one hundred. Read aloud is incorporated in every lesson where we get the opportunity to engage in this! Excellent reading across all groups.

Science



Students are continuing to build subject glossaries of key words/terms and their definitions as they work through new units of knowledge. "Out There Science!" Read aloud sessions are linked to all units and delivered once per topic.

History

As part of our assessment policy in KS3, students will have a literacy focus on their checkpoint assessments. This will enable students to address common spelling mistakes in their unit of work.

Geography



In the current Y9 topic around Tourism, students are reading into the history of tourism, how it grew in the UK and how trends have changed in the 21st century. This includes reading around the good, the bad and the ugly of Dubai - one of the fastest growing tourist destinations in the world!

Spanish

To celebrate this Spanish literary festival, KS3 Spanish pupils will share a Spanish story and Read aloud will be Spanish themed. There will also be the Rose and Wheat event in which pupils can give a rose and wheat picture to a special friend or teacher, writing a message of appreciation in Spanish. Art and Design



Students in year 7 will be looking at the Pop Art Movement and learning key words associated with it, they will be recorded in their sketchbooks and used when talking about their work



In year 8 students will be looking at the Cubist Movement and will also be recording these key words in their sketchbooks and using them in discussions about their work.



In year 9 students will be looking at specific artists based on the theme they are working on (dependent on their teacher) and keywords and text excerpts will also be read aloud to support students who may struggle to read and comprehend each word or meaning. Annotation will be used in the presentation of their work as they approach the end of their project.

Students in years 10 & 11 will be continuing with component 2 (the exam unit) and will be using annotations to support their artwork creations and presentation of ideas and developments. The art library is also easily accessible for further research, progress and independence and available for all year groups

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Drama



Students are working on Romeo and Juliet in Y8 in drama. We're exploring the impact of dramatic irony and how this impacts the genre of the story. In year 9 we are continuing with the work of Mark Wheeler, getting ready for performing a range of his biggest works!

Music



In music we are exploring disciplinary literacy in film music. Also we will be investigating how different recording programmes work.

Design & Tech



Practise their spellings of all the key terms and words they have been learning in their design activities. All the key terms and words are in their project booklets and will be identified by the teachers.



Yr7 and 8 students have completed their key spellings on the sports they have participated in. Students were provided keywords to revise and then completed the spelling tests in PE.

Life



All students in Life are supported in reading with keywords of their Topic Learning Sheets and under pinned with a wide suggested reading list that can help students develop more information around the subjects that they are studying. As part of their learning, students use a 'Cornell Notes' style page to help with keywords and concepts.

ICT



Students in year 10 will be reading and analysing a detailed client brief. They will then provide their own interpretation and identify a client's needs.

We have a fortnightly Literacy meeting where a targeted group of students are considered for a range of interventions. This is put in place and we monitor the impact of this using the STAR Reader Tests.

'Every Child a Reader'

STAR Reader Tests Taking place this week

These important milestone tests are conducted in assessment conditions once every half term in English lessons to accurately gauge progress in reading and language.

STAR Reading assessment is a comprehensive examination that tests the range of students' knowledge of reading and language. Data from this assessment is also used to inform instruction, gauge students' progress, and identify whether one students are meeting the expectations of an related standards.



We complete 6 x STAR Reader Tests throughout the year. During the academic year, all students will take 4 STAR reading tests on the accelerated reader programme. This will give them their reading age and ZPD code so that they can select a book from the library (LRC). Please look at p25 of your child's planner, where they will have recorded their results and you can clearly see your child's reading age. There are lots of different genres and choices within each ZPD code.

ENGLISH HOMEWORK

As part of their English homework, we encourage all students to read for 30 minutes each day. All students also have access to myON, an online library.

Provide targeted vocabulary instruction in every subject

Teachers in every subject should provide explicit vocabulary instruction to help students access and use academic language.

Effective approaches, including those related to etymology and morphology, will help students remember new words and make connections between words.

Prioritise 'disciplinary literacy' across the curriculum

Literacy is key to learning across all subjects in secondary school and a strong predictor of outcomes in later life.

Disciplinary literacy is an approach to improving literacy across the curriculum that emphasises the importance of subject specific support.
