

We are excited to invite all YII parents / carers to the Freeston YII Revision Festival on Wednesday 22nd February.


Students will be participating in events during the day, but you are invited to attend from 3-4pm to listen to parental revision tips & support your child in collecting revision resources from each subject area!


YEAR 7 AUTHOR VISIT
