## **WORLD POETRY DAY - TUESDAY 21ST MARCH**

During the day Key Stage 3 students will be exploring the beauty and power of poetic language. In particular, students will be exploring how poets use language to convey important messages.



During English lessons, students will be reading Joseph Coelho's poem 'If All the World were Paper' to discuss how the poet conveys their feelings about relationships and friendships. Students will be given the opportunity to share their own interpretations of the poem and to also think about how the poem makes them feel. In addition, students will take part in creative tasks to show how they respond to the messages and emotions in the poem.

During period 5, all KS3 students will read the poem 'Dreams' by Langston Hughes. Students will be given time to explore the importance of dreams, ambitions and aspirations. As well as exploring the importance of dreams, students will be encouraged to appreciate the importance of poetry.

Poetry helps us understand the world and also gives us new views of the world. Poetry is so powerful because it allows people to express how they feel and can even inspire people to think differently.

Students will be encouraged to take part in the World Poetry Day competitions.

- Can they produce a piece of artwork that is inspired by one of the poems we have studied?
- Can they write their own poem to express how they feel about their family or friends?
- Can they write about someone who has inspired them? There will be prizes for the best entries!

There are lots of activities on offer including dance, arts and crafts, day trips, sports activities, cooking, food and nutrition activities and much more!


