Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Campaign

In 2022, the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) recorded 199,363 cases of self-generated explicit images. This was a 6% rise from 2021. Unfortunately, this is likely to increase due to social media apps and websites, alongside the increasing sophistication in phone cameras making underage individuals more vulnerable than ever to deception and grooming.

The foundation has unveiled a campaign backed by the UK government and tech partners such as Microsoft, TikTok and Snapchat and aims to raise awareness about the dangers of self-generated imagery. To find out more please follow the link below:
