Criteria for donating toys for Mission Christmas:

- Must be unwrapped.
- Cannot be second hand (unless still in its packaging).
- No food items except selection boxes but must be sealed.
- Clothes should be one-size fits all (hats or scarves, etc). These cannot be hand-made or second hand as they need washing instruction labels and safety tags attached

Criteria for donating food for Normanton Food Bank:

- All food should be non-perishable items.
- Urgent items needed by the food bank are: tinned fruit, tinned custard, coffee, UHT milk (1 litre), biscuits.
- Items they have an abundance of already: beans, soups, cereals, pasta.
- Though the food bank has lots of certain items, please don't hesitate to donate them still as they can be sent to other food banks in the area. NOTHING GOES TO WASTE!
