Children and Young People can often find it difficult to share issues with educational staff. Particularly if they think that those issues will get them into trouble, or if they happen to be of an embarrassing nature. In addition many pupils will find the promise of confidentiality received from staff, difficult to believe. This might be particularly true among children whose familial backgrounds are unstable, or who simply have not had the most positive experiences with trusting adults.

For safeguarding and educational staff alike, the question arising from these situations is 'well how can I help if I don't know what's wrong.' ChildLine's 'Ask Sam' service seeks to aid in these scenarios. The page contains an archive of questions asked to ChildLine from children and young people on a range of issues. In this way it can help to outline the kind of issues people are struggling with.
