Dear parents,

I'm writing to let you know about an exciting opportunity for your son or daughter to join a new choir at Wakefield Cathedral. The cathedral choir has long consisted of boy and girl choristers from various school in the Wakefield area, together with adults singing the alto, tenor and bass parts. In September this year, we started a new choir for young people in school years 10 to 13, singing all four parts, which is open both to former boy and girl choristers and to other young people in the Wakefield area, ideally with some previous singing experience, but who haven't previously sung at the cathedral.

The level of commitment in this new youth choir is considerably lower than the commitment of being a cathedral chorister. The choir rehearses once a week on Friday evenings after school, from 16:30 to 18:00, and sings Sunday services about once a month, as well as joining together with the cathedral choristers and lay clerks for special services and concerts. As the choir develops and grows, we will be exploring extra opportunities for the group. In November, the choir will be taking part in a workshop and recording session with the Gesualdo Six, a renowned vocal consort (see www.thegesualdosix.co.uk for more information).


Members of the cathedral choirs get the opportunity to take part in a wide range of experiences they would be unlikely to get elsewhere, including making professional CD recordings, singing for live television and radio broadcasts, and touring throughout the UK and abroad. Past tour locations have included Poland, Sweden and the USA. We hope that the youth choir will be involved in at least some of these additional experiences. In any case, the chance to sing in our beautiful, historic building on a regular basis is a fantastic opportunity in itself, and members will also receive a very high-quality musical education from the cathedral's music staff. The skills of teamwork and commitment that they gain will be useful whatever they go on to do in life, and membership of this choir will look very good on UCAS and job applications. Many successful people in all sorts of careers, from sport to politics, sang in cathedral choirs in their youth.

Is joining the choir right for me?

Being in the youth choir at Wakefield Cathedral offers so much more than just the chance to be in a singing group.

What are we looking for?

We are looking for young people aged fourteen to eighteen (school years ten to thirteen).

Ideally, you will have some previous singing experience, but the most important thing is that you showcase an

enthusiastic **approach** to singing and learning.

Religious beliefs are also not a requirement, however young people will be taught about Christian traditions and encouraged to think about their own faith and spirituality.

What are the commitments?

One rehearsal most weeks on Friday evenings, alongside two or three Sundays each term, and occasional extra duties.

The timetable runs mostly through **term time only** with the exception of extra duties for special services/concerts and in the run up to **Easter** and **Christmas**.

What are the costs?

Nothing!

There is no cost associated to joining the choir and tours and trips are even often **subsidised** through fundraising and financial support.
